Dear Neighbor,

As work continues today at the site of the gasoline release near the Wallis Run and Loyalsock Creek confluence, I wanted to provide you with a brief update of where we are as of 9:00 a.m. on 10-24-16.

On 10-23-16, maintenance personnel finished capping the north end of the pipeline that crosses Wallis Run, meaning the pipeline is now completely sealed on either end. The damaged section was purged with nitrogen, at which time a small amount of gasoline was recovered, and then the section was removed.

Today, Sunoco Logistics will conduct a nitrogen pressure test on the capped and isolated segments of the pipeline to the north and south of the Wallis Run release site to ensure that the pipeline sustained no additional damage during recent flooding.

Nitrogen is an inert gas that poses no threat whatsoever to life or the environment. It is possible, however, that nearby residents may notice additional gasoline odors during this work, which is being performed in coordination with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection. Air monitoring is being conducted to ensure that air quality remains safe.
