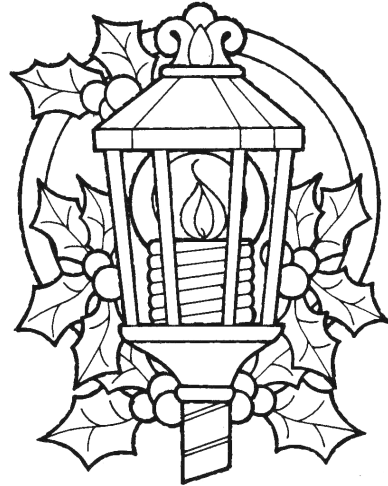

EASY PEANUT BUTTER DOG BISCUIT RECIPE

Ingredients:

2½ Cups Whole Wheat Flour
½ Cup Nonfat Powdered Milk
1½ tsp. Sugar
1 tsp. Salt
1 Egg
1 jar (8 oz.) Peanut Butter
1 tbsp. Garlic Powder
½ Cup Cold Water

Directions:

1. Preheat your oven to 350 and lightly grease a baking sheet or large pizza pan.
2. In a large mixing bowl, mix together all of the ingredients except for the water. Once they're combined, add the water and knead the dough until a ball forms. This should take about 3 or 4 minutes.
3. If you want to use bone-shaped cookie cutters, roll the dough out on a lightly floured surface until it's about a half inch thick and then cut it into shapes. OR...you can just drop the dough by spoonfuls onto directly onto your cookie sheet.
4. Bake for 30 minutes or until golden brown.

QUICK PUMPKIN PUDDING

Ingredients

- 1 pkg. (5 1/10 oz.) vanilla instant pudding and pie filling mix
- 1 can (12 fl. oz.) [Evaporated Lowfat 2% Milk](#)
- 1 can (15 oz.) [Libby's 100% Pure Pumpkin](#)
- 1 teaspoon pumpkin pie spice

Fat free whipped topping (optional)

Directions

Beat pudding mix and evaporated milk according to package directions in large bowl; refrigerate for 5 minutes. Add pumpkin and pumpkin pie spice; mix well. Spoon into dessert dishes. Refrigerate for 10 minutes or until ready to serve. Top with whipped topping, if desired.
