Re: Request for Municipal Adoption of the Five-County Regional Solid Waste Management Plan for Columbia, Lycoming, Montour, Snyder and Union Counties

Dear Municipal Official:

According to our records, your municipality has not yet adopted the Regional Solid Waste Management Plan as requested in our letter dated September 25. I am writing again to ensure that you received our previous request, and to offer to answer any questions you may have about the Plan. A 90-day Municipal Adoption Period for the Plan began September 24, 2012. We are asking each of our municipalities to adopt the Plan no later than their November meeting, so that the Plan can be finalized and submitted to DEP in mid-December.

As required by Pennsylvania's Act 101, the Plan provides for adequate disposal capacity at landfills for our communities' anticipated waste volume for the next ten years. It also discusses potential future technologies and enhancements to recycling services. **We believe that the Plan best suits the needs of our region because it is a "free market plan" that provides flexibility to waste haulers and municipalities.** Unlike some other solid waste plans, this Plan does not recommend a strict flow control system in which haulers would be required to take collected waste to one or two specific landfills. It also does not require municipalities to contract for hauling services for their residents. Based on feedback received during the planning process, it was apparent this was the preference of our communities.

Please note, this Plan does not address sewage or septic in any way, nor does adopting it obligate your municipality to take any further action. Adopting the Plan simply means that your municipality supports the Regional Plan and recommends it be finalized. If the Plan is not finalized by December, the Counties would be forced to restart the public advertisement period, pushing final adoption into 2013, jeopardizing our compliance deadline, and incurring additional significant costs. This is why your help in adopting the plan is so greatly appreciated.

Attached is a model resolution, prepared by our County solicitor, which your municipality can use to adopt the Plan. Once you have adopted the resolution, please mail a copy to me at the address above.

**A RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE REGIONAL
SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT PLAN**

WHEREAS, Section 303 of Pennsylvania's Act 101 of 1988, 53 P.S. §4000.303, requires each county to ensure the availability of adequate permitting, processing and disposal capacity for the municipal waste generated within its boundaries; and

WHEREAS, Section 501 of Act 101, 53 P.S. §4000.501, requires each county to submit to the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (hereafter "PA DEP") an officially adopted municipal waste management plan for municipal solid waste generated within its boundaries; and

WHEREAS, with the knowledge and support of PA DEP, the Counties of Columbia, Lycoming, Montour, Snyder and Union (hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Counties") formed a Five County Regional Steering Committee and undertook to develop a regional municipal waste management plan that satisfies the requirements of Act 101 with respect to each of the five counties; and

WHEREAS, the Five County Regional Steering Committee held meetings, hired consultants, received public comment, performed studies and engaged in the other activities – including without limitation the activities required by Sections 502 and 503 of Act 101, 53 P.S. §§502, 503—necessary to develop, and did develop and approve, a regional municipal waste management plan in conformity with the requirements of Act 101 (hereinafter the "Regional Solid Waste Management Plan", a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A"); and

WHEREAS, Chapter 5 of Act 101, 53 P.S. §§4000.513, requires each of the Counties to adopt the Regional Solid Waste Management Plan after receiving public comment and prior to submitting it to PA DEP for review and approval; and

WHEREAS, Lycoming County ratified, adopted and approved the Regional Solid Waste Management Plan and plans to submit it to PA DEP for review and approval; and

WHEREAS, Plunketts Creek Township is a municipality in Lycoming County, and Lycoming County has requested that this municipality adopt and approve the Regional Solid Waste Management Plan.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Plunketts Creek hereby ratifies, adopts and approves the Regional Solid Waste Management Plan and concurs with the submittal of the Regional Waste Management Plan by the County of Lycoming to PA DEP for review and approval. The Chairman of the Board of Supervisors and such other officers and employees of the Township of Plunketts Creek, as the Chairman may direct, are hereby authorized to execute any documents as may be necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors of Wolf Township hereby ratifies, adopts and approves the Regional Solid Waste Management Plan as its own municipal waste management plan and approves submittal of the Regional Waste Management Plan by the County of Lycoming to PA DEP for review and approval.
