

In 1999 the AKC established an award called the American Kennel Club Awards of Canine Excellence (ACE) in recognition of dogs in the service of mankind. The first ACE award was given in 2000. The award is "in appreciation for the innumerable ways in which dogs meaningfully contribute to our lives".

One award is given in each of the five categories: Law Enforcement, Search and Rescue, Therapy, Service, and Exemplary Companion Dog.

To qualify, the dog is required to be AKC registered or qualified to be registered, and have performed some exemplary act, whether large or small, that has significantly benefited a community or individual.

Last year Abbey was nominated for the award in the therapy dog category. Her picture is on the AKC web site as a nominee. Although, she did not win the award she was given a Certificate of Honor for "immeasurably contributing to the lives of individuals and communities".

Spring Safety Tips

With warmer weather and longer days, nature is undergoing a fresh start and so are homeowners who are ready to clean up the debris that has been accumulating in basements, storage sheds, and garages over the winter. While a good "spring cleaning" can be beneficial, it can also involve a variety of health and safety hazards. The following tips to help you to avoid some of the dangers:

- 1. Household and pool chemicals, paints, and poisons should be properly marked and stored under lock and key, away from children's reach. Dispose of any that are leaking, expired, or that look bad.
- 2. When cleaning up hazardous chemicals wear rubber gloves and follow the safety directions on the packaging. Never mix chemicals in the same container. If you don't know how to dispose of them, seek outside advice. Most chemicals will have a number to call for disposal information printed on the label.



- 3. Make sure gasoline and cleaning fluids are well marked and stored in a cool, dry place away from the house and out of the reach of children and pets. Use only approved containers for gasoline storage.
- 4. Never use gasoline to clean skin, clothes, auto parts, or floors.
- 5. Clean up work areas. Put dangerous tools, adhesives, matches, or other work items away from children's reach.
- 6. Check your barbecue grill for leaks and cracks, and be sure to store any propane tanks away from your house and garage.
- 7. Remove all fire hazards, including stacks of rags, newspapers, and magazines. Pay special attention to the spaces around your furnace, hot water tank, fireplace, space heaters, and clothes dryer, as well as under the stairs.

These are just a few of the safety precautions to consider during your spring cleaning activities. It's also a great time to replace your smoke detector batteries, make sure your fire extinguishers are placed in proper locations and ensure you have a working flashlight and battery powered radio for spring storms. By taking the right precautions, you and those around you can enjoy a safer spring season.
