





Picture Rocks to Become New Home for Veterans Memorial Park





he existing war memorial in Hughesville at Main and Academy streets has been maintained by the Veterans of the Vietnam War Post PA-51 since 1989. Later this year, it will be dismantled and transported about three miles north to a site under development to be known as Picture Rocks Veterans Memorial Park at Nunn Lane and Route 220.

According to a preliminary plan, the monument (see photo, top left) will be positioned in the center of the park with plaques surrounding it that represent the five branches of the armed forces. A brick walkway will be installed leading up to and around the Veterans Memorial (see drawing, bottom left).

To raise funds, bricks are being sold for \$50 each, which will be used to create the walkway. The contributor can choose to have information about a veteran engraved on the brick (see samples at right). The inscription may include his or her name, branch of service, rank, conflict served, and dates of services. The engraving will be limited to three lines of type,

fifteen characters per line (including punctuation and spaces). Additional funds will be raised through corporate and business donations.

Recipe Corner



Peanut Butter Easter Eggs (a little late for Easter but still a yummy treat to make!) Ingredients

½ cup butter (no substitutes), softened

1 cup Jiff peanut butter (reduced-fat or generic brands of peanut butter are not recommended)

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

2 cups confectioners' sugar

2 cups (12 ounces) semisweet chocolate chips

½ cup shortening

Preparation

In a small mixing bowl, cream the butter, peanut butter and vanilla; mix well. Gradually beat in confectioners' sugar. Cover and refrigerate for at least 1 hour.

With a rounded tablespoon of peanut butter mixture form into an egg shape.

In a microwave, melt chocolate chips and shortening; stir until smooth. Dip peanut butter eggs in chocolate; place on waxed paper.

Refrigerate for at least 1 hour. Makes about 2 dozen.

Rachael's Cheesy Scalloped Potatoes

Ingredients

5 or 6 red potatoes, washed and unpeeled

1/3 cup sliced green onions

1 clove garlic, minced

2 cups light cream

3/4 teaspoon salt

of redspectroure

1 cup (4 oz.) shredded Swiss cheese

3 tablespoons butter or margarine

1/3 cup chopped red bell pepper

1/4 teaspoon ground red pepper

3/4 cup milk

1/4 teaspoon freshly ground pepper

1/4 cup grated or shredded parmesan cheese

Preparation

Preheat oven to 350 degrees.

Cut potatoes into 1/8-inch slices, set aside. Melt butter in large saucepan or Dutch oven over medium-high heat, add green onions, red bell pepper, garlic, and ground red pepper. Cook, stirring constantly, for 2 minutes. Add cream, milk, salt and pepper, stirring well.

Add potato slices; bring to boil over medium heat, then cook, stirring gently, for 15 minutes or until potato slice are tender. Spoon into lightly greased 11 x 7-inch baking dish. Sprinkle top with cheeses. Bake in preheated oven for 45 minutes or until bubbly and top is golden brown. Let stand 10 minutes before serving.
