Answers to Frequently Asked Questions November 3, 2020 General Election

Has the November election been delayed?

No. The General Election has not been delayed. It will take place on Tuesday, November 3.

Will polling places be open to vote in person on November 3?

Yes. All 81 voting precincts in Lycoming County will be open for in-person voting. A current [polling place list](#) and an [interactive voting map](#) are available on the Voter Services website.

Can I vote by mail?

Yes. Voters can apply for an absentee or mail-in ballot for November 3. Voters who wish to vote by mail should apply as soon as possible; should [apply online](#) through PA Department of State instead of on a paper application; and should consider returning their voted ballots in person to Voter Services.

Can I cancel my permanent absentee or permanent mail-in status?

Yes. The voter needs to complete a [Request to Cancel Permanent Status](#) form that is available on the Voter Services website or by contacting Voter Services to request it by mail.

When will I receive my absentee or mail-in ballot?

The first absentee and mail-in ballots for the November election were mailed on Friday, October 2. Approximately 11,000 ballots have been mailed already. Mailings are continuing every day until the county's current backlog of 13,000+ ballots has been placed into the mail stream. Voters can track the status of their absentee or mail-in ballots at <https://www.pavoterservices.pa.gov/pages/ballottracking.aspx>. A status of "Pending" is normal and means that your application has been approved and processed.

How can I return my voted absentee or mail-in ballot to Voter Services?

A voter can return a voted ballot by hand-delivering it to Voter Services at 33 West 3rd Street in downtown Williamsport, or by placing it into U.S. Mail to Voter Services at 48 West 3rd Street, Williamsport, PA 17701. Ballots must be hand-delivered or postmarked by 8:00pm on Election Day. Each voter must deliver his or her own ballot in person.
