Species	Size	Description
Eastern White Pine	12-18"	Evergreen: Has soft, long needles. Grows rapidly in a variety of soil and prefers sun. Extremely hardy. Grows to 6 feet in 8-11 years. Max 100ft.
Colorado Blue Spruce	10-18"	Evergreen: Has blue-green color. Can grow 50-75 feet. Good windbreak. Popular Christmas tree. Grow to six feet in 10-12 years. Max 100ft
Norway Spruce	10-15"	Evergreen: Highly valued ornamental and timber tree. One of the best conifers for shelters and windbreaks. Fast growing Max.75-80
Douglas Fir	10-12"	Evergreen: Grows to 60 feet. Grows best in moist, well drained soil. A popular Christmas tree because of its color, symmetrical form and needle retention.
Eastern Red Cedar	6-12"	Evergreen growing 40 to 50 feet. Spread 8 to 20 feet. Medium green needles are flat and scale-like. Should grow in almost any soil, fast dense growth.
White Oak	8-15"	Grows 50 to 80 feet in height and as wide. Grows best in a deep, loamy, well drained soil. The most prolific lumber oak in the Northern Hemisphere. A good tolerance of highway salt.
Sawtooth Oak	6-12"	A large, round-headed tree growing 40 to 60 feet. Produces a large crop of nuts. Acorns are an excellent food for wildlife.
Black Cherry	12-18"	Highly prized in furniture making and is an excellent fire wood. Fruit provides food for wildlife. Grows to 60ft
Silver Maple	10-15"	Very fast growth 50 to 70 feet. Grows fastest in moist, rich, well drained soil. A very popular shade tree because of its fast growth and graceful habit. The best tree for quick shade.
American Persimmon	6-12"	Most ripe American persimmons are used in jams and jellies. Showy fall color and provide wildlife food.
Silky Dogwood	12-18"	Grows to 9 feet. Grows best in well drained, moist soil. Berries attract birds. Very good for soil erosion on banks.
Winterberry Holly	6-12"	Attractive shrub. Provides red berries through the winter. Good wetland plant. Likes acidic soil. Should plant several for good pollination.
American Hazelnut	6-12"	Easy to grow native shrub that produces edible nuts in late summer, excellent hedgerow plant, and is highly attractive to wildlife.
Lilac	12-24"	Dense, vigorous growth to 15 feet. Spread 6 to 10 feet. Masses of very fragrant, light lavender flowers in late spring. Makes a wonderful flowering screen, space 6 feet apart.
White Flowering Dogwood	12-18"	Grows to 40 feet. Bright red berries are food for birds. Does best in rich, moist soil. The White Flowering Dogwood is considered to be the best ornamental of all trees
American Elderberry	10-15"	Vigorous fast growing shrub to 10 feet. Spread 6 to 8 feet. Bluish-black berries used for making jelly, preserves and wine. The berries are also a food source for wildlife.
Eastern Redbud	8-12"	Grows 15-30 ft. with one to several trunks and a wide, umbrella-like crown. Its pink flowers create a showy spring display.
Red Mulberry	6-12"	Fast growing with a broad crown growing to a height of 30 to 50 feet. Prefers warm, well drained soil. Shade tolerant. Mulberries produce excellent jam, jelly, juice and wine.
APPLE* Red Fuji	4-6 Ft. Semi-Dwarf	Full-colored, blush-type that harvests late season with standard Fuji. The tree is healthy and vigorous, and the fruit exhibits the traditional, sweet flavor of Fuji.
APPLE* Idared	4-6 Ft. Semi-Dwarf	Small Semi- Dwarf. This productive tree bears gorgeous red apples. Produces a juicy firm tart apple that is perfect for pies and apple sauce. Ripens in late Sept.

**Apples require another variety for pollination.*
