

The Conservation Learning Trail



The Lycoming County Conservation Learning Trail is 1.2 mile trail that runs along farm fields, through the wetland, and then climbs to the top forested woodlot overlooking the Loyalsock Creek. The trail offers scenic views of the County Farm and the valley. Along the trail, you will find variety of environmental education items, such as invasive and native species markers, and interpretive panels. The trail is open to the public and serves as an open space classroom allowing a variety of educational activities within a natural setting.



Thanks to our summer intern Nathan and Northcentral Pa Conservancy intern Karl, the trail is cleaned-up, and a new footbridge, a lumber heritage sign and a butterfly house have all been installed.

The butterfly house was built and donated by the Jersey Shore Life Skills Class. The class had a great year with Trout in the Classroom Program and will be raising more Brook Trout this upcoming school year.



The Lycoming Audubon Society has installed two screech owl nesting boxes along the trail. They continue to maintain the eight bluebird boxes and the Purple Martin House which is located in the front of the Lysock View Complex. They have hosted a number of bird walks throughout the year.

The Conservation Learning Trail is located at the Lysock View Complex at 542 County Farm Road.
