Species	Size	Description
Eastern White Pine	12-24"	Evergreen: Has soft, long needles. Grows rapidly in a variety of soil and prefers sun. Extremely hardy. Grows to 6 feet in 8-11 years. Max 100ft.
Colorado Blue Spruce	10-18"	Evergreen: Has blue-green color. Can grow 50-75 feet. Good windbreak. Popular Christmas tree. Grow to six feet in 10-12 years. Max 100ft
Norway Spruce	8-12"	Evergreen: Highly valued ornamental and timber tree. One of the best conifers for shelters and windbreaks. Fast growing Max.75-80
Douglas Fir	12-24"	Evergreen: Grows to 60 feet. Grows best in moist, well drained soil. A popular Christmas tree because of its color, symmetrical form and needle retention.
Red Oak	12-24"	Fast growth 60 to 70 feet with equal spread. Grows best in sandy to rich loamy soil in full sun. The fastest growing of all oaks. Tolerant of urban conditions such as salt.
Swamp White Oak	15-18"	Grows to 50 to 60 feet in height and spread. Does well in wet, swampy conditions along rivers and streams. Excellent choice for wetland plantings.
Shagbark Hickory	6-10"	Narrow, upright growth habit. Height to 90 feet. Popular for its sweet edible nuts and shredding bark. Nut production should start in 25 to 30 years. <u>Plant at least ten for pollination.</u>
Black Cherry	18-24"	Highly prized in furniture making and is an excellent fire wood. Fruit provides food for wildlife. Grows to 60ft
Sugar Maple	12-24"	Height 60 to 75 feet. Spread 45 to 50 feet. Mature trees provide sugar products from sap in the spring. A good timber tree. Does not do well in wet areas or in small compact areas.
American Persimmon	12-15"	Most ripe American persimmons are used in jams and jellies. Showy fall color and provide wildlife food.
Silky Dogwood	15-18"	Grows to 9 feet. Grows best in well drained, moist soil. Berries attract birds. Very good for soil erosion on banks.
Winterberry Holly	10-12"	Attractive shrub. Provides red berries through the winter. Good wetland plant. Likes acidic soil. Should plant several for good pollination.
American Hazelnut	18-24"	Easy to grow native shrub that produces edible nuts in late summer, excellent hedgerow plant, and is highly attractive to wildlife.
Black Chokeberry	10-15"	Height 3 to 5 feet. Spread 10 feet. Purplish-black berries in fall. Good for naturalizing, a fast screen, food for wildlife. Very adaptable species will grow on dry sandy hillsides.
Black Willow	18-24"	Vigorous growth to 35 feet. Bark is dark brown with yellowish branches. Pale green, 5 inch long leaves spring through fall. Yellowish green catkins in early spring. A wetland plant
Red Mulberry	6-8"	Fast growing with a broad crown growing to a height of 30 to 50 feet. Prefers warm, well drained soil. Shade tolerant. Mulberries produce excellent jam, jelly, juice and wine.
BLUEBERRY Bluecrop	12"	A highbush blueberry cultivar. It produces all-purpose blueberries that are firm and somewhat tart — great for preserves, baking, freezing, and fresh eating. With this shrub, you will have a large crop to harvest. of fruit every July.
BLUEBERRY Earliblue	12"	A medium-sized shrub that is typically grown for its edible qualities. It produces large clusters of blue round berries which are usually ready for picking in early summer. The berries have a sweet taste and a juicy texture.
APPLE* Cardinal Cortland	4-6 Ft. Semi-Dwarf	Small Semi- Dwarf, Won't turn brown! This productive tree bears gorgeous ruby red apples. Also perfect for pies and cider. Cold-hardy. Ripens in mid Sept.
APPLE* Honeycrisp	4-6 Ft. Semi-Dwarf	A medium-to-large sized apple, with a light green/yellow background largely covered with red-orange flush with strong hint of pink if grown in good sunlight. The skin may be flecked with occasional russet dots.

**Apples require another variety for pollination.*
