CORRIDOR PLAN OVERVIEW

The recently completed Lycoming County
Brownfield Assessment Program identified and
evaluated Brownfield opportunities in four municipal
clusters around the County. Through that two
corridors were identified as having an extremely
high redevelopment potential. Two separate
Corridor Plans will be developed, one for each of
the following locations: the City of Williamsport
and the Borough of Montgomery.

PROCESS

Through the utilization of a three-step approach involving Feasibility, Visioning and Implementation, the Corridor Plans will provide a comprehensive understanding of the areas and allow for community input to be integrated into realistic, implementable plans.

OUTCOMES

The Corridor Plans will give the municipalities the opportunity to plan for future development in a sustainable and innovative matter that highlights each municipality's individuality. With a long-range vision, the plans will provide a legacy for the future that transcends administrations, making this project adoptable and realistic.
