

Recycling Options in Lycoming County

Recycling Drop Off Sites

There are over 20 drop off locations in Lycoming County. Materials collected at the drop off center vary depending on need and demand of the community. All drop off sites are source separated.

Curbside Collection—Limited

Curbside recycling collected by LCRMS is only available for the mandated communities, Williamsport, South Williamsport, and Loysock Township. Once a month, the County collects separated clear/brown/green glass, aluminum cans, and steel cans.

Another Recycling Option—Single Stream Recycling!

Single Stream Recycling

Single stream recycling is a curbside service available to residents and businesses in all areas by participating local haulers for a nominal fee. Single stream recycling is the most convenient way to recycle, using one bin and placing all recyclables into this container. You can recycle MORE materials with single stream than you can at the drop off sites, such as plastics #3-7 and cartons.

The Journey of the Recyclable Items




1 RECYCLE! You may drop off your items at a collection site or use a curbside collection service. The journey for recycling starts with you and this step.



2 All items are brought to and deposited onto Lycoming County's facility tipping floor for processing. It's important that non-recyclables are removed at this time.



3 The material is mixed by the loader and placed into a metering bin to start the sortation process.



4 First line is the 'pre-sort' line where scrap metals, shredded office paper, and other bulky items are removed from the conveyor line. At the end of this line, materials are separated by fibers (papers, cardboard) and containers (plastics, metals, cartons) for additional sortation.



5 Pictured above is one of four green machines, each machine optically sorts each different type of plastics (#1 PET, #2 HDPE Colored and Natural), and one is designated for cartons. Further down the line, a magnet is used to sort out steel/tin cans and then an eddy current machine is used to separate aluminum cans.



6 Once all materials are sorted, each material is baled together for shipment. The bales are sold to an end market where the materials are made into something new!

**Acceptable materials at drop off sites vary. Most locations accept Plastics #1 & 2, glass, aluminum and steel cans, cardboard, mixed office paper. Please check our website first.*

***Single stream recycling accepts the above materials AND plastics #3-7, cartons, junk mail, and other materials noted on our website. Contact your waste hauler for details.*

*Drop off locations do **NOT** accept electronics, wood, window panes, plastic bags, garbage.*
