

### NO. 586. CORN A LA SOUTHERN

Yield: 100 servings, approximately ½ cup each.

Inguedients	100 servings	+1	 . 1	servings					
Corn, cream style	3 No. 10 cans		 *						

- 1. Combine all ingredients; mix well.
- Pour into well greased baking pans. Bake in slow oven (300° F.) about 1 hour or until firm.















### Grandma's Wilted Garlicky Salad



### INGREDIENTS

- 3 heads of Romaine lettuce
- 1 12-16 oz. bag of radishes
- 1 bunch of green onions
- 1-small container of cherry tomatoes
- 2 Avocados (must be ripe)
- ½ cup fresh squeezed lemon juice (from 2 lemons)
- ½ cup olive oil
- 3 large garlic cloves (minced)
- ½ tsp. black pepper
- 1/2 tsp salt (use 1/4 tsp if using optional seasoning salt)

### **DIRECTIONS**

Wash and dry all produce. Slice the radishes and then cut each slice in ½. Cut each avocado in half and then remove the pit. Scoop out the flesh and then cut into chunks. Tear the lettuce into bite sized pieces and slice the bunch of green onions. Half each cherry tomato.

Place all the prepared produce in a very large mixing bowl and toss.

In a medium sized bowl, add the lemon juice, oil, garlic and other spices. Whisk well. Pour this dressing over the prepared produce and mix well.

Cover the salad and then let it rest in the refrigerator for at least 6 hours (preferably overnight) in order for the lettuce to wilt and the flavors to blend.





# Double A and B and C Brownies-IT WORKS



### **INGREDIENTS**

- 1 cup of all-purpose flour
- 1 cup cocoa powder (unsweetened)
- 1/2 cup avocado, mashed
- 1/3 cup no sugar added applesauce
- 1 small ripe banana (mashed)
- 1 egg
- 1 15-oz can of low sodium black beans rinsed and drained
- 1/2 tsp baking soda
- 1 1/4 tsp. vinegar (be careful to measure correctly)
- 1 tsp vanilla (optional)
- 1/4 cup chopped nuts and/or mini chocolate chips (optional)

### **DIRECTIONS**

(Preheat oven to 350 degrees F)

In a large mixing bowl, mix using a spoon the mashed avocado, banana, apple sauce and cocoa together.


In a food processor or blender pulse and/or blend the black beans with the egg until pureed and smooth. Fold this into the avocado mixture.

Add the baking soda, flour and mix just until blended. Add the vinegar and along with the optional ingredients (if using).

Mix gently until well incorporated about 10 strokes or 20 seconds.

Pour the browning mixture into a 8x8 pan lightly coated with cooking spray.

Bake for about 25 minutes






