CHOCOLATE UPSIDE-DOWN CAKE

chocolate cake mix
¹/₂ cup butter or margarine
¹/₄ cup water

1 cup brown sugar, packed
1 cup chopped nuts
1 can (3 1/2 oz.) coconut

Preheat oven to 350° . Melt margarine or butter in a 9 x 13 x 2-inch pan. Add water; sprinkle brown sugar evenly in pan. Arrange nuts and coconut in sugar. Mix cake mix as directed and pour over mixture in pan. Bake at 350° for 45 to 50 minutes. Let stand for 5 minutes for topping to set. Turn upside down onto large platter.
