





National Purple Heart Day August 7, 2023



The Purple Heart is awarded in the name of the President of the United States to any member of the Armed Forces of the United States who, while serving under competent authority in any capacity with one of the U.S. Armed Services after 5 April 1917, has been wounded or killed. Specific examples of services which warrant the Purple Heart includes:

- a) any action against an enemy of the United States;
- b) any action with an opposing armed force of a foreign country in which the Armed Forces of the United States are or have been engaged;
- c) while serving with friendly foreign forces engaged in an armed conflict against an opposing armed force in which the United States is not a belligerent party;
- d) as a result of an act of any such enemy or opposing armed forces; or
- e) as a result of an act of any hostile foreign force.



For decades, therapeutic horse riding has offered help to individuals as they overcome serious physical and emotional challenges.

If the Veteran chooses to ride, the movement of the horse's gait, at a walk, is similar to a human's walking motion. The horse's simulated gait can assist wounded Veterans to strengthen specific muscle groups, which may ultimately aid the Veteran as he or she relearns how to walk or use a prosthesis.

Horses naturally react strongly to a person's anxiety. This can act as a mirror for the Veteran to become aware of and learn to control their anxiety level. We work with the Veteran to read the horse's behavior and react in a way that deescalates anxiety in both horse and Veteran.



What and Who are Heroes & Horses

Heroes & Horses was developed to serve our Veterans. We are here to help improve lives of our Heroes through connection with horses. Whether it's through riding, which is optional, or just hanging out and grooming. We have developed this program to assist Veterans and show just what Horses have to offer in ways of healing the mind, body, and soul.

Heroes & Horse is starting it's 8th season in 2023. We stated with 2 Veterans and our roster is up to 32 registered Veterans. We have seen first-hand how horses can help someone get through many obstacles they are facing, be it physical or emotional. We have seen first-hand the sacrifices of so many military members and we want to give back to those who have sacrificed so much, our Veterans.

Our Heroes & Horses program is an 8–10 week program and riding will begin in about 5 or 6 weeks, providing the Veteran is ready and willing to ride. Riding is optional in this program as it's about much more than riding. This program is free to all Veterans and our lessons are conducted by PATH Intl. Instructors and community volunteers who are dedicated to helping each Veteran reach their full potential.

What's the PACT Act and how will it affect my VA benefits and care?

The PACT Act is perhaps the largest health care and benefit expansion in VA history. The full name of the law is The Sergeant First Class (SFC) Heath Robinson Honoring our Promise to Address Comprehensive Toxics (PACT) Act.

The PACT Act will bring these changes:

- Expands and extends eligibility for VA health care for Veterans with toxic exposures and Veterans of the Vietnam, Gulf War, and post-9/11 eras
- Adds 20+ more presumptive conditions for burn pits, Agent Orange, and other toxic exposures
- Adds more presumptive-exposure locations for Agent Orange and radiation
- Requires VA to provide a toxic exposure screening to every Veteran enrolled in VA health care
- Helps us improve research, staff education, and treatment related to toxic exposures

If you're a Veteran or survivor, you can file claims now to apply for PACT Act-related benefits.

- Thanks to the <u>PACT Act</u>, VA is now able to "presumptively" provide benefits to Veterans who live with hundreds of toxic-exposure related conditions including many cancers and illnesses.
- o This means that when eligible Veterans apply for benefits, they do not need to prove that their service caused their condition; instead, VA automatically assumes service-connection for these Veterans and provides benefits accordingly.

Community care must be first authorized by VA before a Veteran can receive care from a community provider.


