



The Department of Defense expanded commissary shopping privileges in the U.S. effective 1 January 2020 as part of the Purple Heart and Disabled Veterans Equal Access Act of 2018, included in the John S. McCain National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2019. This expansion adds to the existing authorized shopper list.

Access was expanded to include:

- Veterans with any service-connected disability
- Purple Heart recipients
- Former Prisoners of war, and
- Individuals approved and designated as the primary family caregivers of eligible Veterans under the Department of Veterans Affairs Program of Comprehensive Assistance for Family Caregivers

HOW TO DETERMINE ELIGIBILITY OR OBTAIN YOUR VETERAN HEALTH IDENTIFICATION CARD (VHIC) IF YOU DON'T ALREADY HAVE ONE.

Find out if you're eligible for VA health care benefits through their website: https://www.va.gov/health-care/eligibility.

You can apply through one of the following methods if you meet eligibility requirements.

- 1. Phone: 877-222-8387, Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. ET to get help with your application.
- 2. Mail: Fill out the Application for Health Benefits (VA Form 10-10EZ).
- 3. In Person: Fill out the Application for Health Benefits (VA Form 10-10EZ).
- 4. With help of a trained professional: You can work with a trained professional called an accredited representative to get help applying for health care benefits.

WHAT YOU NEED TO DO BEFORE YOU SHOP.

- 1. Confirm your Veteran Health Identification Card (VHIC) has one of the required designations, (SERVICE CONNECTED, MEDAL OF HONOR, PURPLE HEART, FORMER POW), or obtain your Veteran Health Identification Card (VHIC) as outlined above. You will need this for your commissary checkout experience.
- 2. Contact the base you intend to visit beforehand and determine what their current policy is for base access.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT CREDIT CARD/DEBIT CARD USER FEES.

1.9% for Credit and Signature Debit Cards

The fees will be assessed at 1.9% of the total transaction cost to these new patrons who use credit cards and signature debit cards, which are accepted and processed as credit transactions.

0.5% for PIN Debit Cards

The assessed fee will be 0.5% for personal identification number (PIN) debit card transactions.

User Fee Exemptions

Individuals paying cash and using the MILITARY STAR card, Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) Electronic Benefits Transfer (EBT) and eWIC cards will not be assessed the user fee on their transactions.

Chewy Oatmeal Raisin Bars or Cookies

Ingredients (Serves 12)

- 2 cups old fashioned rolled oats, not quick oats
- $1\frac{1}{2}$ cups whole wheat flour
- 1 large whole egg
- 2 egg whites
- 1 cup ripe avocado, cubed
- 1 medium-sized very ripe banana
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup unsweetened apple sauce
- 1 tbsp. baking powder
- $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. salt
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup raisins
- 1/2 tsp cinnamon
- ¹/₂ cup shredded coconut (optional)

Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F
- 2. In a large mixing bowl, mash the banana and avocado flesh until a puree and smooth. Can use a food processor or blender to puree and then add it to a mixing bowl.
- 3. Add the apple sauce, baking powder, salt, cinnamon and eggs and mix well until all is blended.
- 4. Fold in the flour, oats until the dry ingredients are wet. Add the raisins and fold in until mixed well.
- 5. Pour the batter in to a very lightly greased (using cooking spray), baking dish 13x9x2.
- 6. Bake in the oven for 25-28 minutes or until a toothpick comes out clean and the sides are lightly browned.

Cut into 12 pieces. Store in a covered container in the refrigerator.

Tips

- This recipe can be used to make 12 cookies. Just place 12 equal scoops on a baking sheet (nonstick and or lightly greased) and bake for 15-28 minutes.
- Nutrient Analysis excludes the optional ingredients and includes the use of low-sodium baking powder and a packed cup of raisins.

FOR THE REUBEN

- 3 lbs. thinly sliced pastrami
- 12 oz. sauerkraut
- 4 slices rye bread, toasted
- 8 slices Swiss cheese
- 2 tbsp. chives, chopped

For the Thousand Island Dressing

- 1 cup mayonnaise
- 1 cup ketchup
- 3 tbsp. relish
- 1 tbsp. sriracha

Directions

THOUSAND ISLAND DRESSING

1. In a large mixing bowl add ketchup, sriracha, mayonnaise, and relish. Mix together and season with salt and pepper.

RUEBEN

1. Take toasted rye bread and top with thousand island dressing, sauerkraut, pastrami, and Swiss cheese.

PLACE IN 350 DEGREE F OVEN UNTIL CHEESE IS MELTED AND SANDWICH IS HOT ALL THE WAY THROUGH. TOP WITH CHOPPED CHIVES AND SERVE.

National Purple Heart Day August 7, 2022



The Purple Heart is awarded in the name of the President of the United States to any member of the Armed Forces of the United States who, while serving under competent authority in any capacity with one of the U.S. Armed Services after 5 April 1917, has been wounded or killed. Specific examples of services which warrant the Purple Heart includes:

- a) any action against an enemy of the United States;
- b) any action with an opposing armed force of a foreign country in which the Armed Forces of the United States are or have been engaged;
- c) while serving with friendly foreign forces engaged in an armed conflict against an opposing armed force in which the United States is not a belligerent party;
- d) as a result of an act of any such enemy or opposing armed forces; or
- e) as a result of an act of any hostile foreign force.





Go to <u>www.myhealth.va.gov</u> and log onto your My HealtheVet account using your User ID and Password.



NO. 303. CREAMED DRIED BEEF

Yield: 6 gallons,

100 servings, one cup (8 ounces) each.

Ingredients	100 servings	servings								
Flour, sifted	1 pound (1/2 No. 56 dipper)									
Water (for milk) Pepper	11/2 gallons (6 No. 56 dippers)									

- 1. Separate beef into small pieces.
- 2. Mix melted fat and flour; stir until smooth.
- 3. Mix milk and water; heat. Add gradually to flour mixture, stirring constantly.
- 4. Add chipped beef and pepper. Heat to boiling point; reduce heat and simmer about 10 minutes.
- NOTE. Serve hot over toast.



(If this is your first time using Secure Messaging you may be prompted to read and agree to a Terms and Conditions Agreement.)

- a. Click on "Messages" box on the MHV Home page.
- Under "Preferences" verify your correct email address is entered and turn New Secure Message Notifications on.
- c. You can set up a signature block for your messages if you wish. The "Title" can be formal or informal, as you wish, but cannot be left blank (you can put the cursor in that block and just hit the space bar and apply changes if you want the title "blank").

- c. Then, click on the test results link you wish to see.

Building Better Caregivers[®] (BBC) is an online program to help Caregivers of Veterans with dementia, memory problems, post-traumatic stress disorder, a serious brain injury or any other serious injury or illness. The Caregiver must meet criteria and be willing to participate in the Caregiver support program in either the Program of Comprehensive Assistance (PCAFC) or Program of General Caregiver Support Services (PGCSS) programs.

The Veteran whom the Caregiver is caring for must be enrolled in VA Healthcare.

VA publishes Interim Final Rule for Legal Services for Veterans Grant Program

WASHINGTON — As part of the Department of Veterans Affairs' national homeless prevention efforts, VA published an <u>Interim Final</u> Rule which allows VA to enhance the provision of legal services for Veterans experiencing or at risk for homelessness.

Under section 4202 of the Johnny Isakson and David P. Roe, M.D., Veterans Health Care and Benefits Improvement Act of 2020, VA will, through the Legal Services for Homeless Veterans and Veterans At-Risk for Homelessness Grant Program, offer up to 75 grants each year to eligible entities, with at least 10% of funding being utilized for women Veterans.

These grants will also satisfy section 5105 of the Act, which requires VA to partner with outside organizations to provide legal services to women Veterans.

"Providing full access to justice and legal services for Veterans takes unified, inter-agency partnerships, from the Federal level down to states, cities and communities at the grassroots-level where Veterans work and live," said VA Secretary Denis McDonough. "This first-of-its-kind grant will ensure that legal services are available nationwide to Veterans in need."

LSV-Homeless builds on existing <u>legal services</u> offered to Veterans through partnerships between VA and legal service providers in communities across the U.S. Services provided by the new grants will support Veterans' legal needs related to such housing, family law issues, income support, criminal defense, and requests to upgrade the characterization of a discharge.

A Notice of Funding Opportunity with instructions on how to apply for a grant is expected to be published in September 2022 once the Final Rule for the grant program is complete.

VA suspends annual reassessments in the Program of Comprehensive Assistance for Family Caregivers

WASHINGTON — The Department of Veterans Affairs is suspending annual reassessments for participants of the Program of Comprehensive Assistance for Family Caregivers while the department continues its review of PCAFC.

This applies to all Veterans and family caregivers participating in the program; additionally, VA will not discharge or reduce stipends based on a reassessment.

"President Biden has made clear 'because Veterans are the backbone, the spine of who we are as a country,' we have a sacred obligation to care for them, their families, caregivers and survivors," said VA Deputy Secretary Donald Remy. "Although we've come a long way in supporting caregivers through the Program of Comprehensive Assistance for Family Caregivers, we have much more work to do. In our effort to uphold our sacred obligation to families of Veterans, VA continues its review of PCAFC to ensure department requirements and procedures meet the needs of caregivers and Veterans participating in the program."

Facility Caregiver Support Program staff will however continue to initiate reassessments for Veterans and family caregivers for certain purposes, such as when a Veteran or caregiver requests to be considered for an increase in stipend level or if there is evidence of an increased need for personal care services. VA will also continue to conduct wellness visits. Appeal and review options for those who disagree with a PCAFC determination remain the same.

Under section 201 of the Commander John Scott Hannon Veterans Mental Health Care Improvement Act (Public Law 116-171) and regulations VA published at <u>38 CFR part 78</u>, VA will award grants to eligible entities that apply for such assistance to provide or coordinate suicide prevention services for Veterans and other eligible individuals at risk of suicide and their families.




