Official Notice of Election for Military and Overseas Voters Lycoming County November 8, 2022 General Election

This is an official notice of an election to be conducted on November 8, 2022 in Lycoming County. Military and overseas electors may register to vote and request an official absentee ballot by using the Federal Postcard Application (FPCA), available at www.votespa.com, www.fvap.gov, or the Voter Services website at www.lyco.org/vote. You may apply for an absentee ballot by submitting your FPCA by fax to (570) 320-2117 or by email to voterservices@lyco.org.

Military and overseas electors may request an absentee ballot at any time prior to a primary or election. However, if time does not permit you to receive and return an official absentee ballot, you are also entitled to vote using the *Federal Write-in Absentee Ballot* (FWAB), available at www.votespa.com, www.fvap.gov, or the Voter Services website at www.lyco.org/vote. Military electors may use the FWAB to register to vote and vote simultaneously.

The FWAB can be used to vote for ALL federal, state, and local offices and ballot initiatives.

To vote, refer to the instructions and page 3 of the FWAB application.

To vote for federal offices (President, U.S. Senator, or U.S. Representative in Congress), write in the name of the candidate of your choice in the space provided on the FWAB.

To vote for state offices, local offices, or ballot initiatives, write the names of candidates or ballot initiatives in the Addendum section of the FWAB. Under the **Office/Ballot Initiative** heading, enter the office the candidate is running for or the title of the Ballot Initiative (referendum). Under the **Candidate Name, Party Affiliation, or Initiative Vote** heading, list the name of the candidate you wish to vote for, or if you are voting on a Referendum question write YES or NO.

**Montgomery Borough
Local Office Referendum**

Do you favor the reduction of the total number of members of the Montgomery Borough Council from seven (7) members to five (5) members?

Plain English Statement

This referendum question, if approved as a result of the number of “Yes” votes being greater than the number of “No” votes, would decrease the size of Montgomery Borough’s Council from the current number of seven (7) members to the number of five (5) members. Montgomery Borough would then have five (5) council members on the Council instead of seven (7) members. If approved at this General Election, then at the municipal election in November of 2023, two (2) members of council will be elected to four-year terms instead of three (3) members, and at the municipal election in November of 2025, three (3) members of council will be elected to four-year terms instead of four (4) members. Thereafter, the proper number of members of council shall be elected to four-year terms corresponding to the number of members of council whose terms are scheduled to expire on the first Monday of the following January.

This referendum question, if not approved as a result of the number of “No” votes being greater than or equal to the number of “Yes” votes, would mean that the number of council members would remain at seven (7). The terms of council member offices would remain at four (4) years according to the current schedule of when the terms of council member offices are scheduled to expire.
