Vote by Mail Information May 18, 2021 Municipal Primary

Absentee Ballots are for registered voters who are unable to vote in person because they will be out of the municipality for work or school, or because of an illness or disability.

Mail-in Ballots are for registered voters who are not eligible to apply for an absentee ballot, but who wish to vote by mail instead of in person. No excuse or reason is required.

A voter may apply to vote by mail in the following ways:

- Apply online at <https://www.VotesPA.com/ApplyMailBallot>.
- Print a PDF application from the Voter Services website at www.lyco.org/vote and mail the completed form to Lycoming County Board of Elections, 48 W 3rd Street, Williamsport, PA 17701.
- Apply in person at Voter Services, first floor of Third Street Plaza, 33 W 3rd Street, Williamsport. Business hours are Monday–Friday, 8:30am–5:00pm.
- Call Voter Services at (570) 327-2267 to request that an application be mailed to you.

The deadline to apply to vote by mail is Tuesday, May 11 at 5:00pm. Emailed or faxed applications cannot be accepted. Postmarks do not count. Voters who experience an emergency after the application deadline may be eligible to apply for an emergency absentee ballot – contact Voter Services to learn more.

The county begins mailing ballots approximately 30 days before each election.

The deadline for Voter Services to receive voted ballots is Tuesday, May 18 at 8:00pm. If you plan to deliver your voted ballot in person, you must deliver it yourself. If you have a disability that prevents you from delivering your ballot yourself, contact Voter Services to request the form to designate an authorized agent who can deliver your voted ballot on your behalf.

Active-duty military and their dependents and civilians residing overseas apply for absentee ballots using different forms and deadlines. Contact Voter Services to learn more.

A voter who applies to vote by mail may only vote at a polling place on Election Day by provisional ballot, unless the voter brings the official ballot and official return envelope to the polling place to surrender in order to vote by regular ballot.
